Sacramento has something in common with New Orleans that no one should ignore...

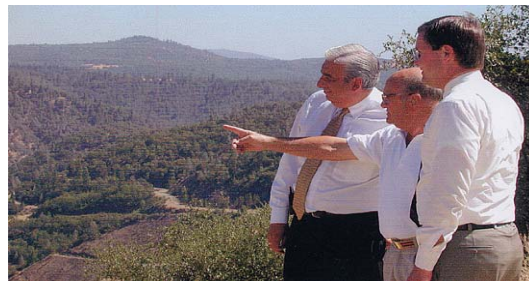
Sacramento has the **lowest level of flood protection** of any city in the country, and in recent years, has twice come within mere inches of flooding.

In 1996, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers found that building the **Auburn Dam was the most effective way to protect Sacramento from flooding**. In addition, it would meet our region's water supply needs and generate enough power to keep the lights on.
